#### **Something Special is Happening**

On November 5th, 300 of our members gathered for a future planning session. Guided by a vision of Little Antioch, our people shared ideas on what that might look like. 2,600 individual ideas were gathered! A strategic planning team *read and recorded* every one of them, categorizing them into major buckets.

Many of the responses were simply good ministry ideas. Our staff is already reviewing and incorporating into everyday ministry. Other ideas were the big, audacious vision that God might be calling us to. You can hear a summary at our February 5th Leadership Forum (7:00 at Christ Memorial).

As I reviewed the data, I had two reflections. **First, our people are eager!** Simply gathering 300 people on a Sunday afternoon was remarkable. One of the top responses (hundreds) was that our people want to be sent. You may feel unprepared, or you may not know where to serve, but the passion exists. We'll be working on ways to more effectively deploy our greatest asset people!

A second reflection is summed up in a Christmas card I received from two members. This couple has been a part of our church for about 5 years. They wrote, "We consider Christ Memorial a huge blessing in our lives. We want to tell you that we feel something special is happening in our congregation."

**"Something special is happening."** I concur. There is something beyond the data, something we can't measure, control, or quite put our finger on. It is most certainly the work of the Holy Spirit.

For instance, in 2023 we had over 30 baptisms, with an increasing number of adult baptisms. These are literal conversations. Some come from other religions, and some from no faith at all. Already this January 2024, we have two adult baptisms.

The Word of God does what it says. The greatest factor in our future is not strategic planning, but the mighty movement of God. He will likely surprise us, and we wouldn't have it any other way. We will work diligently and wisely, but at the end of the day the Spirit will govern and guide our ministry.

More people loved in Christ, more people sent into the world.

## Sanctuary Refresh Update



Our sanctuary enhancement plans are coming together. It's like a puzzle to schedule our artist and general contractor all within the active use of our sanctuary. Construction and installation is slated for the end of April and beginning of May.

#### **Project Scope**

- Chancel fixtures
- Restored Stained Glass (from our former sanctuary)
- Sanctuary Screen (chancel art installation), new center cross with eight glazed ceramic relief symbols, telling the Biblical narrative (see example of "Creation" - left)
- Custom lighting to highlight stained glass and sanctuary screen



#### **Biblical Narrative Symbols**

Left of Cross: Creation—Covenant—Exodus—Manger
Right of Cross: Crown—Great Commission (Fishers of Men) - Pentecost—Alpha/Omega

#### Sanctuary Screen (above)


To be installed as a new chancel backdrop, made from steel tubing and sections of painted copper. There will be eight glazed ceramic mosaics and relief symbols, telling the Biblical narrative from creation to the return of Christ. The center will feature a new cross with manger and crown symbols to the left and right.

#### **Stained Glass Panels**



# Reliant College Ministry Prayer Room

"How long would you spend in a prayer room? Ten minutes? Fifteen if there is a candle?"

That was a rather cynical joke between a student and myself. In all honesty, it would be good to shake whatever makes me think that prayer is only a moment in worship, a few minutes of a day, or even a tool we use in our most desperate moments.

Zach Smith has faithfully led the college ministry every Sunday evening this past fall and will continue into the spring. He taught the students concerning prayer for 5 weeks, culminating in a prayer room experience at Reliant one evening. Zach was hesitant to tell me how it went, however the students shared nearly 3 hours together in prayer.

Zach explained what he sensed took place that evening, "Students stuck around longer than expected because God does exactly what he has promised to do. God has promised to be present with us."

That is exactly what prayer is for us: Not a plea for God to be more present or to convince God to do something we would have him do for us. It is coming to recognize and see the work God is already doing in his world and our lives.

There was cake, tea, coffee, and a giant card with over 100 birthday greetings inside.




# Law & Gospel: Deep Sin & Deeper Grace
